

A good research question needs to be clear, focused, concise, complex, and arguable.

Sample Research Question:

Are single-use plastics bad for the environment?

This is a good start, but let's make it better



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Make your question more specific. Add demographic or geographic details to help specify your question.

Are single-use plastics **in coastal regions** bad for the **marine** environment?

Narrow your question to something arguable. Add details on how to prove something with your research.

Does banning single-use plastics in coastal regions **affect** marine environment?

Expand the complexity of your question.



Add details that make your question answerable beyond a yes, no, or with something too simple.

What impact does banning single-use plastics in coastal regions have on the marine environment?

This final research question will be easier to research than the initial question. It also address a current issue.

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
