In cooperation with Senator Charles S. Fenwick, the Town of Fairfax has secured options on 150 scres of land near the Town of Fairfax which it feels would be a suitable location for the Site of the Forthern Branch of the University of Virginia.

In January of 1958, the same site was presented to the local jurisdictions but the indications were at that time that, although the site was suitable, another site (which is not now available) was their first choice. The Town did not present the matter further and did not present the matter formally to the Board of Visitors.

Poeling as we do at this time, that the Town's offer may very well be acceptable to all the jurisdictions in the loth District, we sincerely hope that the matter may be considered by the Board of Visitors and found to be acceptable.

Therefore, on behalf of the Town of Fairfax, I hereby offer to the University of Virginia a site of 150 acres of land located on Route 123 immediately adjoining its southern boundary. The tract has 1500 feet of frontage on Route 123 and is approximately the same distance from the intersection of 123 and Braddock Road on the east side of said Soute 123. The land was secured by the Yown of Fairfax for this purcess through the cooperation of the Farr family of the Town. The Town will aske available to the site municipal facilities of sower, water, and other services.

The site is felt to be equal to or better than any of the ones formerly considered.

- 1. The tract contains 150 acres, which is large enough for initial needs. This tract has the advantage over many other proposed sites in that there is adjacent land presently available for possible future expansion.

The Youn of Pairfex would very much appreciate the opportunity of presenting the matter to the Board of Visitors or to its proper consistee at any time that such a meeting can be held, if you doos it proper.
