Gennady Chufrin, co-chair since 1989: For ten years a Soviet diplomat in South and Southeast Asia; former Deputy Director of the Institute of Oriental Studies, now Southeast Asia department head there; Corresponding Member of the Russian Academy of Sciences. He is also the Russian co-chair of the Inter-Tajik Dialogue within the framework of the Dartmouth Conference Regional Conflicts Task Force.

Vladimir Vinogradov: former Soviet Ambassador to Japan, Iran, Egypt; head of the Soviet delegation at the Middle East Peace Conference in 1973; Deputy Foreign Minister of the Soviet Union; Foreign Minister of the Russian Federation before Kozyrov; now chairman of the Veterans of Diplomatic Service.

Victor Yakunin: former Russian Ambassador to Pakistan.

Mahmud Gareev, retired General (four stars): former head of military advisors in Afghanistan; doctor of military science and of the history of military affairs; President of the Academy of Military Science; recently published his book on Afghanistan.

Andrei Zagorsky, Deputy Director of the Institute of International Affairs of the Foreign Ministry (MGIMO), described as "younger and more conservative than the above."

Sergei Strokanig, journalist familiar with Central Asia, writer in the new *Newsweek* joint-venture magazine.

Vitaly Naukim, President of the Russian Center for Strategic Research and International Relations and head of the Middle East department at the Institute of Oriental Affairs. He is a scholar of Middle Eastern and Central Asian affairs and is the manager of the Inter-Tajik Dialogue.

Irina Zviagelskaia, Vice President of the Russian Center for Strategic Research and International Relations and professor and senior researcher in the Institute of Oriental Studies. Scholar on Middle Eastern and Central Asian affairs and participant in the Inter-Tajik Dialogue.

Vladimir Moskalenko, head of the South Asian department in the Institute of Oriental Studies.
